Ghanteswari Temple-



ABOUT THE SEMINAR

Criminal law is one of the most crucial branches of law as it directly impact day-to-day human behaviour. It is a branch of law that manifests the relationship between the state and citizens. Crime is an universal phenomenon. Crime causes irreparable damage to the individual. With the passage of time criminals are socio-economics offence, organized crime, role of media using innovative ways to commit crime. They use advanced in criminal trial, narcotic drugs technology to commit the crime against women and juveniles. The use of cyber space and use of forensic tools in investigation needs a serious debate to streamline and strengthen the existing Criminal Justice System in India. The existing criminal justice is plagued by many problems, including inordinate procedural delay and low conviction rate. Further, there is uncertainty regarding important matters such as the criteria for granting the death polygraph, brain mapping, data-base of crime and penalty. There is need to bring change to the benefit of the criminals, cyber crime. victim, as the existing system is focused on punishing the offender rather than providing relief of justice to the victim. There is a need to strengthen victim and witness protection scheme, and an overall increased victim participation in criminal trials and the criminal justice system. It is pertinent to mention here that the existing law is not gender neutral. There is an scheduled caste and scheduled tribe, honour killing imminent need to reconcile the law with evolving egalitarian realities of the contemporary society and to make the criminal procedure more accessible, speedy, and less complicated. There is also criticism regarding arbitrary arrest and the alleged highhanded behavior of police officials. It is indeed an uphill task to strike the delicate balance between the powers granted to the officials involved in the administration of criminal justice on one hand, and the protection of civil liberties of the suspected offender(s) on the other. There is an urgent need to deliberate upon the changing contours of criminal law prevailing in the present day context. With the advent of information technology, law has to face many challenges.

The objective of the seminar is to have discussion, debate, deliberation and discourse on the new dimension of criminal law. In light of the stated objectives, participants are requested to N.B. Themes mentioned above are not exhaustive, only discuss the issues and challenges, reformatory measures adapted illustrative. and the way forward on the prevailing criminal justice system in India.
