The Vice Chancellors of all Universities offering and examining Nursing Programmes.

Sub: The need for Strict adherence to the Scheme of Examinations laid down by INC - reg.

Sir/Madam,

As you are aware, in accordance with Section 16 (h) & (i) Indian Nursing Council Act, the eligibility criteria and Guidelines for the various Nursing examinations have been notified through regulations by INC for strict compliance by the Universities/examining bodies whose Nursing qualifications have been recognised by INC. However recently several instances regarding deviations in the examination schemes, flouting the INC guidelines, have been brought to the notice of INC, in the context of registration of Candidates, by various SNC's with reference to the Certificate and mark list of the qualified candidates (like non- adherence to minimum pass marks in theory and practical papers separately etc). Keeping in view the career interest of the candidates who have already qualified. However in the Interest of ensuring the uniform standards improving the quality of Nursing Education, INC cannot allow such deviations from the prescribed eligibility criteria and exam schemes to continue. All Universities are to ensure that henceforth the Admission Eligibility Criteria and the Guidelines for Examination notified by INC are strictly followed. It is needless to mention here that if conditions for admission to the Nursing Course and the Scheme of examination for the INC recognised Nursing Qualifications are not in conformity with the regulations Notified by INC, then the candidates possessing such qualification shall be entitled to be registered in that State Only where the University/Examining board is situated. {Section 14 (3) (b) of INC Act}.

For the sake of ready reference the examinations Guidelines and Academic Eligibility Criteria for the B.Sc. (N) course is given below for ensuring strict compliance by all concerned.

1. Anatomy and Physiology: question paper will consist of Section A- Anatomy of 37 marks and Section B- Physiology of 38 marks.
2. Nutrition and Biochemistry: Question paper will consist of Section A- Nutrition of 45 marks and Section B- of Biochemistry of 30 marks.
3. Pharmacology, Genetics, pathology: Section A- Pharmacology of 38 marks, Section B- Pathology of 25 marks and Genetics of 12 marks.
4. Nursing Research & Statistics: Nursing research should be of 50 marks and Statistics of 25 marks.
5. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only and to be conducted as college exam and marks to be sent to the University for Inclusion in the mark list.
6. Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to computer to be conducted as College exam and marks to be sent to the University for Inclusion in the marks sheet.
7. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical papers separately.
8. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
9. Candidate must pass in internal and external examinations in each of the papers separately.
10. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical).
11. The candidate if fails can be permitted for admission to next year.
12. The candidate shall have to clear all the previous examinations before appearing in final year examination.
13. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years

14. A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each subject for appearing in the examination.
15. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.
16. No institutions shall submit average internal marks of the test students more than 75% i.e. if 40 students are admitted in a course, the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75% of total internal marks. (Example of 5 students: A=25, B=20, C=22, D=21, E=24 Average score = 84.6%, this will not be accepted by the State Nursing Registration Council).
17. Maximum number of candidate for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day under any circumstances.
18. All practical examination must be held in the respective clinical areas.
19. One internal and one external examiner should jointly conduct practical examination for each student.
20. An examiner should be a lecturer or above in a college of nursing with M.Sc (N) in concerned subject and minimum of 3 years of teaching experience in the collegiate program. To be an examiner for nursing foundations course faculty having M.Sc (N) with any speciality shall be considered.
21. On completion of internship, internal assessment out of 100 marks should be sent to the University for inclusion in the mark sheet.
22. Final year examination results shall be withheld till the candidate completes required attendance for practical and internship.

Admission Guidelines:

1. The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission is sought.
2. **Minimum Educational Qualification:**
 - a. A candidate should have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology (PCB) and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks taken together in PCB at the qualifying examination (10+2).
 - b. Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government having science subjects and English only.

c. English is a compulsory subject in 10+2.

3. Candidate shall be medically fit. However, Colour Blind candidates should be considered for admission to Nursing Courses subject to the condition that Colour corrective contact lens and spectacles are worn by such candidates.

4. Candidate shall be admitted once in a year.

5. Reservation Policy:

- For disabled candidates 5% Disability reservation to be considered with a disability of locomotor to the tune of 45% to 50% of the lower extremity and other eligibility criteria with regard to age and qualification will be same as prescribed for each nursing programme.
- Admission under the reserved quota shall be subject to reservation policy and eligibility criteria for SC/ST/OBC/PwD/S as prescribed by the Central Govt. State Govt. Union Territory as applicable to the College concerned.
- Reservation SC/ST, OBC or any other shall be as per the Central Govt./State Govt. rules as applicable.

Note: Reservation shall be applicable within the sanctioned number of the seats.

REGULATION FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE NURSING EXAMINATION (FOUR YEARS COURSE)

(Effective for the students admitted to 1st year of Basic Nursing Course during 2019-20 and afterwards as per the norms of Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi).

1. Duration of the Course and Examinations

1.1 The four year Course leading to the Bachelor Degree in Science for Nursing shall spread over for a period of four academic years and the University shall conduct the following examination :

- i. First University Examination
- ii. Second University Examination
- iii. Third University Examination
- iv. Fourth (Final) University Examination

1.2 A candidates for B. Sc. Nursing Examination shall be required to enroll himself/ herself, under these regulations as a students In one of the colleges affiliated to this University.

2. Admission

2.1.A A candidate should have passed in the subjects of physics, chemistry, Biology (PCB) and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks taken together in PCB at the qualifying Examination (10 +2)

2.1.B Candidates are also eligible from state open school recognized by state Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government having Science subject and English only.

2.1.C English is a compulsory subject in 10 +2

2.2 In case of students of SC/ST category or any special category, eligibility fixed by the Govt. Of Odisha/ Indian Nursing Council/ U.G. C. Shall be adopted.

2.3 The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the course:

2.4 The candidates shall be medically fit for seeking admission to the course (However, colour Blind candidates should be considered for admission to nursing courses subject to the condition that colour corrective contact lens and spectacles are worn by such candidates).

2.5 Candidate shall be admitted once in a year. Selection for admission be made on Merit basis as per the mark secure by the candidates in the Entrance Test, conducted by the College or entrance test conducted by any regulatory authorities.

2.6 Reservation Policy and Selection of the candidates for admission to the course in state quota, if any, shall be done by the State Government and other seats shall be filled up at the college level as per the procedure mentioned above at 2.5.

- 2.7 The classes for B.Sc. Nursing Course shall start from 1st week of October each year or may be decided by the State Government in Health and Family Welfare Department (Nursing Directorate).

3 Readmission

- 3.1 The following categories of students may seek readmission to first year.
- a) Those who have discontinued study in the First year of previous academic year on valid ground and have obtained prior permission from the Principal.
 - b) Those who fallen short of required attendance in the first year of Previous academic year.
 - c) Those who have been debarred for some definite period in the first year of previous academic year provided the provided of punishment is over by the time of admission.
 - d) Provided further that the above categories of candidate may be readmitted in the first year subject to availability of seats.

3.2. Admission to Second, Third and Fourth (Final) Year:

- A) Admission to Second, Third and Fourth Year shall be completed within two weeks of the re-opening of the colleges without waiting for the publication of result of the first, second and third University examinations respectively, provided that students may be admitted to the Second, Third and Fourth year as the case may be, within a further period of two weeks including Sundays and holidays on payment of a late fee as prescribed by the University.

Provided further that students who could not appear University Examination due to shortage of attendance shall be allow to take readmission in the same year at the beginning of the immediate subsequent academic session.

- B) The candidate if fails can be permitted for admission to next year as per INC guidelines.
- C) if a candidate has not cleared all subjects from 1st year to 3rd year, he/she may not be allowed to fill up from to appear 4th year (final year) Examination

4. Qualification for admission to the first, second, third and final University Examination

- 4.1 Any registered students of the university may be admitted into or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examination in which he /she offers a regular course of study for not less than one academic year after passing the higher secondary education, Odisha, or any other examination recognised by the academic council as equivalent thereto, provide he/she is not otherwise ineligible to appear the said examination.
- 4.2 Any registered student of the university may be admitted to the second examination for the B.Sc. Nursing if he/she has cleared the first examination or has appeared the said examination and has thereafter completed a regular course of study for not less than one academic year in the second course in one or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examinations. Provided that he/ she is not otherwise ineligible for appearing the said examinations.

- 4.3 Any registered student of the university may be admitted to the Third examination or has appeared the B.Sc. Nursing if he/she has cleared the Second examination or has appeared the examination and has thereafter completed a regular course of study for not less than one academic year in the Third year course in one or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examinations. Provided that he/ she is not otherwise ineligible for appearing the said examinations.
- 4.4 Any registered student of the university may be admitted to the Fourth/Final year examination for the B.Sc. Nursing if he/she has cleared the Third examination or has appeared the said examination and has thereafter completed a regular course of study for not less than one academic year in the Fourth year course in one or more colleges admitted for the purpose of such examinations. Provided that he/ she is not otherwise ineligible for appearing the said examination.
- 4.5 In order to clear the examination (first/ second/third/fourth (final), the candidate is required to secure 50% in each of the theory and practical paper separately except in English paper. The pass mark in English is 40%.

5 Pass marks and classification of successful candidates:

- 1.1 Aggregate marks of 2800 (including English, Computer and Internship marks to be given by the College) for passing the B.Sc. Nursing Examination shall be the sum total of the aggregate of the first, second, third and fourth (final) examination taken together.
- 1.2 class or division.
- 5.2.1 Pass
- (I) A minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the theory & practical separately.
 - (II) A minimum pass marks shall be 40% in English. English Examination will be conducted at the college level and marks to be sent the university for inclusion in the mark sheet.
 - (III) Theory and practical Examination for introduction to computer shall be conducted at the college level and marks be sent to the university for inclusion in the mark sheet. The pass mark shall be 50% out of 50 marks.
- 5.2.2 Second class
- Below 60% in aggregate of the subjects in all the examinations taken together be awarded second Class (first, second, third & final examination)
- 5.2.3 First Class
- 60% or above marks in aggregate of the subjects in all the examinations taken together be awarded First Class.
- 5.2.4 Distinction
- A Candidates who obtains 75% of marks or above in a subject (s) taking theory and practical mark together of the concerned subject (s) and Passes all examination in the first appearance shall be declared to have with distinction in that subject (s).
- 5.2.5 Year wise issue of mark sheets- In order to clear the Examination 1st year, 2nd year, 3rd year and 4th year issue the original university mark sheet separately year wise.

7.11 On completion of internship, internal assessment out of 100 marks should be sent to the university for inclusion in the mark sheet.

7.12 Final year examination results shall be withheld till the candidate completes required attendance for practical and internship.

8 Paper setting and examiner.

8.1 The board of studies shall recommend the number of paper setters/ examiners to set the questions and evaluate the scripts. The paper setters shall be from outside the jurisdiction of the university.

8.2 A lecturer or above in a college of Nursing with M.Sc. (Nursing) in concerned subject with 3 years teaching experience or lecturer or above in a medical college in the concerned subject with 3 years teaching experience shall be appointed as examiner/ paper setters.

8.3 Question setting

8.3.1 Anatomy and physiology –
Question paper shall consist of section- A; Anatomy of 37 marks and B; physiology shall be of 38 marks.

8.3.2 Nutrition And biochemistry
Question paper shall consist of section- A; Nutrition of 45 marks and section B; Biochemistry 30 marks.

8.3.3 Pharmacology, Pathology and Genetics
Section A of Pharmacology with 38 marks section B Pathology of 25 marks and section C Genetics 12 marks

8.3.4. Nursing Research & Statistics
Nursing Research shall be of 50 marks and statistics of 25 marks.

9. Course instruction

9.2 (I) Details of scheme of examination as per annexure-II

10. Internship

10.1 Internship shall be carried out as per the Indian Nursing Council's Guideline. During internship 8 hours of integrated clinical duties shall be made including two week of evening and night shift duties and 48 hours per week. Students shall be supervised by the teachers during the period of internship.

10.2 The candidate shall not be permitted to appear fourth (final year) examinations unless he/she completes the internship.

6 Provision for back repeat Examination

6.1 If a candidate marked absent or fails in a paper is either in theory or practical technique, reappear in that paper(s) in both the theory and practical.

6.2 In order to clear the failed paper(s) a candidate shall be permitted to reappear those paper(s) in subsequent two chances immediate to the first attempt or payment of prescribed fee.

6.3 In no case a candidate shall be allowed to appear any examination after eight years of first (Nursing Student) registration to first university examination. Further the maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.

7 Examination

7.1 The examination shall be held once in a year as per the schedule specific below

1 st year Examination	1 st week of September
2 nd year Examination	2 nd week of September
3 rd year Examination	3 rd week of September
4 th year Examination	4 th week of September

7.2 The examination in B.Sc. Nursing shall be conducted by means of written papers and there shall be a practical examination in all subject as per the syllabus. The question shall be set in English and students are required to answer it in English.

7.3 The duration of examination for each theory paper shall be three hours.

7.4 All practical examination shall be held in the respective clinical areas and maximum number of candidates for practical examination shall not exceed 20 per day.

7.5 One internal and one external examiner shall jointly conduct the practical examination for each student. Both internal and external should be qualified in M.Sc Nursing. Minimum 5 each examiners can conduct practical of all 7 papers in case of necessity. Further the internal examiner shall be from concerned college teacher (M.Sc Nursing) and the external (M.Sc Nursing) shall be from the other affiliated college of the university or from outside university.

7.6 A candidate has to pass in theory and practical examination separately in each of the paper.

7.7 Candidate must pass in internal and external examination in each of the papers separately.

7.8 The candidate shall have to clear all the previous examinations before appearing in final year Examination.

7.9 No institutions shall submit average internal marks of the test student more than 75% i.e. if 40 students are admitted in a course, the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed score=75% of total internal marks. (Example of 5 students: A=25, B=20, C=22, D=22, E=24 Average 89.6%, this will not be accepted.)

7.10 An examiner should be lecturer or above in a college of nursing with M.Sc. (N) in concerned subject and minimum of 3 years of teaching experience in the collegiate program. To be an examiner for nursing foundations course faculty having M.Sc. (N) with any speciality shall be considered.

11.1 A candidates must have minimum 80 % attendance (Irrespective of the kind absence.) In theory and practical in each subject to be eligible to appear the examination.

11.2 A candidates must have 100 % attendance in each of the practical areas (field work/ internship) before publication of the final result (before awarding degree certificate).

12. Application for admission to examination.

12.1 the application submitted by each candidates for admission to examinations (first, second, third, final) shall contain a certificate of the candidates by the head of the institutions/ principal regarding.

- I. Good conduct
- II. Diligent study
- III. Percentage attendance
- IV. Passing of periodicals/ test examinations
- V. Completion of internship before final examination

12.2 A candidates shall pay the requisite fees for admission to any examination as fixed by the university from time to time.

12.3 If a candidate has paid the fees for all the subjects in any examination but remain absent in the examination shall not be refunded and he/she shall be required to pay the fee to appear the same examination

13. Migration

13.1 Any registered candidate of other university of the state may migrate to this university with prior permission of the DMET Orissa, to register in any examination (first, second, third, final). In such case, the marks obtained by the candidate earlier in other university shall be consider to publish

15 Publication of result

- 15.1 The result of B.Sc. Nursing Degree Examination and the classes to be awarded shall be on the basis of combined result of the first, second, third & fourth (final) examinations taken.
- 15.2 The list of those candidates who passed in 1st class and with distinction shall be arranged in merit and the list of their successful candidates shall be arranged alphabetically and college wise. In case of a candidate obtaining distinction it shall be mentioned against his/her names in the list.
- 15.3 Candidate who passes in their 1st appearance and in one session shall be placed above those candidates who passed in back paper clearances in the merit list.
- 15.4 Each successful candidate at the final examination of the B.Sc. Nursing Degree Course shall receive a diploma in the prescribed form of Sambalpur University signed by the Vice-Chancellor.

Regulation of Post Basic B. Sc. Nursing (2 years Course)
W.E.F. - 2018-19

(Effective for the students admitted to 1st Year of Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Course during 2019-20 and afterwards as per the norms of Indian Nursing Council, New Delhi).

1. Duration of the Course and Examinations

1.1 The Two year course leading to the Bachelor Degree in Science for Nursing shall spread over for a period of Two academic years and the University shall conduct the following examinations :

- (i) First University Examination
- (ii) Second University Examination

1.2 A candidate for Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Examination shall be required to enroll himself/herself, under these regulations as a student in one of the colleges(s) affiliated to this University.

2. Admission

2.1 A candidate who has passed the GNM course shall be eligible for admission into the Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.

2.2 In case of students of SC/ST category or any special category, eligibility fixed by the Govt. of Orissa /Indian Nursing Council/U.G.C shall be adopted.

2.3 The minimum age for admission shall be 20 Years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the course.

2.4 The candidate should be medically fit for seeking admission to this course.

2.5 Selection for admission be made on merit basis as per the marks secured by the candidate in the Entrance Test conducted by the college or entrance test conducted by any regulatory authorities.

2.6 Selection of candidates for admission to the course in State quota, if any, shall be done by the State Government and other seats shall be filled up at the college level as per the procedure mentioned above at 2.5.

2.7 The Classes for Post Basic B. Sc Nursing shall start from 2nd week of October each year or as may be decided by the Director, Medical Education and Training, Orissa.

3. Re-Admission

3.1 The following categories of students may seek readmission to Second year.

- (a) Those who have passed first year's internal examination conducted by the College.
- (b) Those who have discontinued study in the previous academic year on valid ground and have obtained prior permission from the College with fulfilling all the conditions to appear first year examination.
- (c) Those who have not fallen short of required attendance in the previous academic year.

3.2 Admission in to second year.

Admission to second year shall be completed within two weeks of the re-opening of the colleges without waiting for the publication of results of the University examinations.

4. Qualification for admission to the First and Second University Examination.

- 4.1 Any registered students of the University may take admission into first year.
- 4.2 As it is a regular course the student cannot continue any other regular course till completion of current course.
- 4.3 In order to clear the examination First & Second (Final), the candidate is required to secure 50% in each of the theory and practical paper separately except in English paper. The pass mark in English is 40%.

5. Pass mark and classification of successful candidate:

- 5.1 Aggregate marks for passing the Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Examination shall be the sum total of the aggregate of each year.

5.2 Class or division

5.2.1 Pass

- (i) A minimum marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical separately.
- (ii) The pass mark is sum total of internal assessment mark and theory / practical mark secured in university examination.
- (ii) A minimum pass mark shall be 40% in English.

5.2.2 Second Class

Below 60% in aggregate of all the subjects in all the examinations taken together be awarded second class.

5.2.3 First Class

60% or above marks in aggregate of all the subjects in all examinations taken together be awarded First Class.

5.2.4 Distinction

A candidate who obtains 75% of marks or above in a subject (s) taking theory and practical mark together of the concerned subject (s) and passes all examinations in the first appearance shall be declared to have passed with distinction in that subject (s).

6. Provision for Back/Repeat Examination

6.1 If a candidate marked absent or fails in a paper (s) either in theory or practical he/she has to reappear in that paper(s) in both the theory and practical. He/she will be promoted to next year and reappear the paper(s) in next year.

6.2 In order to clear the failed paper(s) a candidate shall be permitted to reappear those paper(s) in subsequent two chances immediate to the first attempt on payment of prescribed fees.

6.3 In no case a candidate shall be allowed to appear any examinations after 4 years of first registration to first university Examination.

7. Examination

7.1 The Examination shall be held once in a year as per scheduled specified below.

1st year Examination 2nd Week of September

2nd year Examination 2nd Week of September

7.2 The Examination in Post Basic B. Sc. Nursing shall be conducted by means of written papers and there shall be a practical examination in all subjects as per the Syllabus. The question shall be set in English and students are required to answer it in English.

7.3 The duration of examination for each theory paper shall be of three hours.

7.4 All practical examinations shall be in the respective clinical areas and maximum number of candidate for practical examination shall not exceed 20 per day.

7.5 One internal and one External examination shall jointly conduct the practical examination.

8. Paper setting and Examiner

8.1 The Board of studies shall recommend the number of paper setters/examiners to set the questions and evaluate the scripts. The paper setters shall be form outside the jurisdiction of the University.

8.2 A lecturer or above in a college of Nursing with M.Sc. (Nursing) in concerned subject with three years teaching experience or a lecture or above in a Medical

 - (ii) Diligent Study
 - (iii) Percentage attendance
 - (iv) Passing of Internal Assessment
 - 11.2 A candidate shall pay the requisite fees for admission to any examination as fixed by the University from time to time.
 - 11.3 If a candidate has paid the fees for all the subjects in any examination but remained absent in the Examination shall not be refunded and he/she shall be required to pay the fees to appear the same examination.
 12. Migration
 - 12.1 Any registered candidate of other University of the state may migrate to this University with prior permission of the D.M.E.T, Orissa, to register in any examinations (First & Final). In such case, the marks obtained by the candidate earlier in other University shall be considered to publish his/her result.
