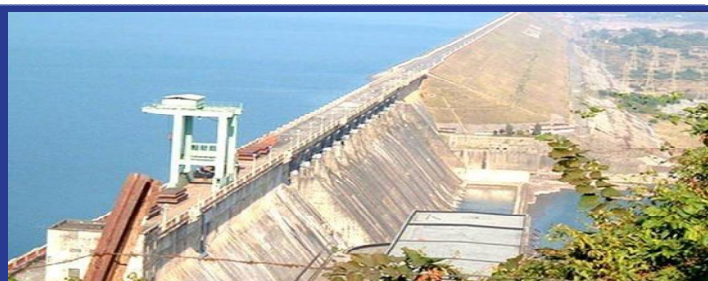

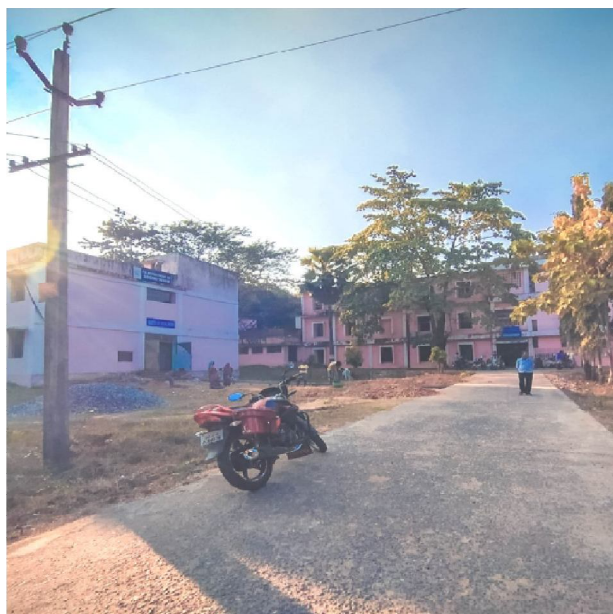

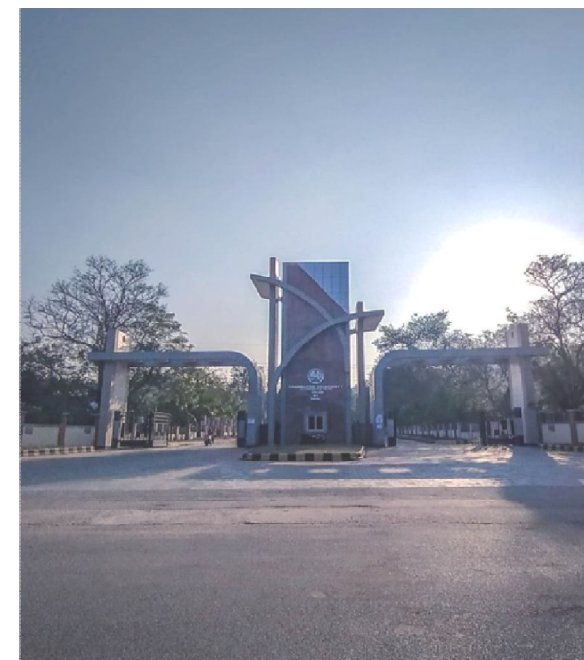


About the seminar
