repercussions which will be much more catastrophic than that of a nuclear explosion or an atomic war.

Keeping in view of the periodic and intense growth of science and technology, probably the brutality that the globe has been witnessing is nothing but the negative repercussions of the said development. Though there are a lot of speculations going as to the anthropogenic causes, that, it was initiated by some countries, it is evidently worth assuming that, it is going to be very easy for an enemy country to initiate a war or external aggression in another country by using a very small amount of highly communicable virus. And the consequences will be unimaginably brutal.

The way, both the state and the central governments in India dealt with the situation, reflects plethora of similarities with that of the consequences of an imposition of Emergency under Part XVIII of the Constitution of India. However, dealing an emergency like situation with the weapons of ordinary legislations like National Disaster Management Act, 2005 and the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897 raises prudent questions as to the legality and reasonability of the executive actions of both the governments.

In the light of this the question arises as to, whether the time has come to enhance the ambit of the definition of war and External Aggression as envisaged under the part XVIII of the Indian Constitution which deals with the Emergency provisions? Is it possible, that a country, by
