Abstract of the research work (max. 300 words)	In the world’s history, Indian caste system has survived till date from eternity, Ritual purity forms the base on which intricate structure of caste erects social groups. Irrespective of variations among religions and passage of true through birth a person is tagged into a caste that lasts up to death. Pundits claim the existence of four Principal varnas that facilitated the caste system for 2000 years. In social hierarchy, the large caste categories, from top to bottom, are Bramhins(Priest and Teachers) Kshyatriyas (rulers and soldiers), the Vaishyas (merchants and & traders), and the Shudras (labourers& artisans).Scheduled Castes (SCs)are actually outside the varna system as a fifth category and they are assigned tasks looked upon as ritually polluting, hence regarded untouchable in the traditional varna system. Scheduled Tribes (STs)

	<p>also don't fall within the caste hierarchical order. The four principal castes accommodate thousands of sub-castes, called jaties, endogamous groups divided further along professional, sectarian, regional and linguistic lines. The SCs and STs are tagged by the name varna- shankara, being outside the system'- placed below other castes for they are deemed pollutants and therefore 'untouchable'. Within the broad category of outcasts, they form several sub-castes. As a rule, SCs are bound to occupational structures in which they are born whereas the first four varnas has freedom to choose and change their occupation. Now a day's atrocity is a brutal crime against Scheduled castes and scheduled tribes. They are always treated vulnerable and weaker sections of the society. They are leaving in outside of the village. They are treated untouchables. There are number enactments and policies framed by the government to stop the caste violence but these enactments are not properly implemented.</p>
