Abstract of the Research Work	<p>The demographic transition and the ensuing increase in the number of older people have significant implications all over the world. The social landscape of India has changed as a result of modernization, industrialization, migration of the younger generation, and changing lifestyles. As a result, there are now significantly more nuclear families, which supports an individualistic culture. With this trend, older people are more likely to experience socio-economic marginalisation. Many older people have been forced to opt for old age homes (OAHs) due to lack of adequate support and care within the family. The notion of institutional care is rapidly expanding and gradually becoming more prevalent in this context. Literary evidences reveal that OAH options are crucial in the current scenario, especially for those older people who have been abandoned and are alone. With this background, the researcher has attempted to understand the factors that led older people to relocate to old age homes; their concerns, and perceptions in these institutional settings. In addition to these issues, the study also aims to look at the key challenges confronted by institutionalised older people. The study will be carried out in the districts of Cuttack and Khordha in Odisha, as these two districts are among the top five in terms of the concentration of senior population with larger number of old age home facilities.</p>
