Madam / Sir,

You are aware that we are in the final stage of adopting a uniform CBCS syllabus for implementation in 2019-20 academic session across the state. There are 2 papers under Skill Enhancement Compulsory Course (SECC) which all undergraduate students are to opt for apart from other core, DSE and GE papers. The SECC papers are to be such that it helps the students in improving their competency as per the requirement of the market. As per the decisions made in the all Vice Chancellors conference, a three VC committee of Utkal, RDWU and Ravenshaw Universities was constituted for drafting of a model SECC-I paper (Communicative English - Special Course) and SECC-II paper (Quantitative and Logical Thinking). English and Maths faculty of these Universities were involved in designing the syllabus. The syllabus of these 2 papers was approved in the VCs conference held on 6th December 2018.

Hence, you are requested to add these 2 papers to the existing list of SECC I and II papers for approval in your University's academic council for their adoption by students studying in II year in 2019-20 (admission year 2018-19).


This is also one of the annual performance milestones under World Bank assisted program OHEPEE. In 2018-19, these papers will be taken up for the 2nd year students studying in the World Bank assisted 70 colleges. Later, it is hoped that these papers will be adopted by the remaining colleges in the state.

Therefore, you are requested to ensure the following

1. Formalities for approval of enclosed syllabus by academic council by end of Feb 2019
2. Circulate the approved syllabus to all 70 colleges under OHEPEE by end of Mar 2019


All the students of 2nd year will be taking the SECC I and II papers and the colleges have been advised to limit the class size to 64. So you are requested to offer both SECC I and II papers both in odd and even semesters so that the English and Maths faculty at the colleges are able to effectively cover the workload.
